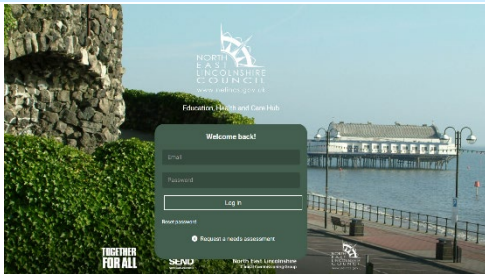
Autism Mentoring
